Dress Code (As amended at the Executive Council Meeting on 25 August 2018)

1. OBJECTIVES

- 1.1 To determine the Rules & Regulations pertaining to appropriate clothing when a member is representing the Federation, whether as part of a National or Federation squad, or the recipient of a slot to an international match.

2. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

- 2.1 Unless inconsistent with the context, all words and expressions imparting the masculine gender shall include the feminine, words signifying the singular number shall include the plural and vice versa.
- 2.2 In the event of any doubt as to the meaning of any of the provisions of this agreement, the interpretation placed thereon by the Executive Council shall be final and binding upon all members of the Federation.

3. RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 3.1 When attending the Opening Ceremony or actually participating in the competition, including the shoot offs, members will wear:
 - 3.1.1. Shirts as approved by the Executive Council.
 - 3.1.2. Long or short pants in the colour as approved by the Executive Council.
 - 3.1.2.1. The national squad manager or the Federation, as applicable, will co-ordinate whether long pants and/or shorts are to be worn for the Opening Ceremony.
 - 3.1.3. Baseball-type cap in the National colours, if applicable or the official Federation cap.
 - 3.1.3.1. Headwear providing increased coverage to the back of the neck is also permitted.
 - 3.1.4. Appropriate footwear.

3. RULES AND REGULATIONS (cont)

- 3.2 When attending the awarding of medals and/or other forms of recognition and/or prizes, members will wear:
- 3.2.1. National or Provincial Colours blazer or jacket, as applicable.
 - 3.2.2. White collared shirt.
 - 3.2.2.1. Ladies may wear a white blouse.
 - 3.2.3. National or Provincial Colours tie or other, as applicable.
 - 3.2.3.1. Ladies may wear a scarf or bow-tie.
 - 3.2.4. Long pants in the colour as approved by the Executive Council.
 - 3.2.4.1. Ladies may wear an applicable-coloured skirt.
 - 3.2.5. Appropriate footwear such as closed shoes or boots, preferably brown.
 - 3.2.5.1. Ladies may wear court shoes or appropriate sandals.
 - 3.2.6. Members who are not part of a National squad may wear attire commensurate with cocktail-party standards.
- 3.3 When travelling or attending any other function pertaining to the competition, members will wear:
- 3.3.1. Neat pants (long, short or tracksuit)
 - 3.3.2. Official shirt, as applicable.
- 3.4 Members will:
- 3.4.1. Present a neat appearance at all times.
 - 3.4.2. Wear the appropriate dress as determined by the national squad manager or Executive Council, if required to attend any other functions as representatives of South Africa and/or the Federation.
- 3.5 A maximum of three sponsors badges are allowed on one sleeve of the official shooting shirt.
- 3.5.1. The area below the event logo, on the back side of the shirt, may be used for any number of additional sponsor logos.

4. National Shooting Shirts

- 4.1 The National badge, being the King Protea, must be visibly displayed on the chest on the left hand side.
- 4.2 The minimum acceptable size of the National badge must be 7cm in length and 6.5cm wide.
- 4.3 Sponsor logos may not exceed the size of the National badge.
